Amendment to 2023-24 Draft Budget (Ref: 35/5)

A report from the Interim Financial Officer dated 16 March 2023 was circulated.

Trustee West welcomed Councillors Naidoo-Rauf and Hutt, and Lisa Topcsov, the Partnership & Sponsorship Manager – Key Projects, from Hamilton City Council (HCC) who were in attendance for Item T/23/02/1.2. After a brief delay due to technical difficulties, Councillor Casey-Cox also joined the meeting (via Microsoft Teams).

MOVED: (West/Silverton) That the following amendment to the Budget be approved before the adoption of the 2023-24 Annual Plan:

The FY23 investment portfolio budget increase by \$35,000 to reflect the recent FY22 market value movement.



T/23/02/1.2 2023-24 Draft Annual Plan and Budget (Ref: 35/5)

A report from the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) dated 22 March 2023 was circulated.

Trustee West advised that seven submissions to the 2023-24 Draft Annual Plan had been received in total. He invited the HCC representatives to speak to HCC's staff submission.

Councillor Naidoo-Rauf introduced herself and her colleagues, and offered thanks for the opportunity to speak and expand on the HCC submission.

The following was noted:

- Hamilton is a fast-growing city where there are many opportunities to create a
 future-fit place that is truly liveable, but there are also challenges to meet the
 needs of community, such as rising living costs and increased infrastructure
 needs, which are impacting ratepayers
- HCC supports the overall direction of the Trust's Draft Annual Plan but acknowledges there is opportunity to do more
- Current and future generations could benefit from:
 - Increased community grant funding
 - Maximising strategic long-term investment and impact
 - Collaboration between the Trust/Company and HCC, particularly on HCC's:
 - Long Term Plan priorities
 - Our Climate Future: Te Pai Tawhiti o Kirikiriroa
 - City Investment Programme

Trustee West enquired as to specific infrastructure priority projects HCC has identified, to which Ms Topcsov and Councillor Naidoo-Rauf highlighted the Pukete Neighbourhood House facility and Te Papanui Enderley Centre upgrades.

Trustee West indicated that the Draft Annual Plan included an increase in community funding of approximately \$2M to \$7M, some of which could potentially be spent on larger capital projects.

There was some discussion with regard to how the proceeds from the sale of UltraFast Fibre Ltd (UFF) were being invested, ie, renewable energy systems that would provide increased grant funding over time, while supporting network reliability.

It was acknowledged that a balance needs to be struck between strategic investing for broad impact, and the funding of smaller community groups.

Trustee West pointed out the tax efficiencies of the discount programme.

Trustee Chew sought clarification on HCC's desire to see a portion of the UFF proceeds invested in the community in the short-term. Councillor Hutt observed that this could be used strategically across the community, rather than distributed randomly.

Trustee West reiterated that one of the Trust's primary roles is to ensure that the Company is operating as an efficient business, providing consumers with a reliable network and the best possible electricity pricing.



Councillor Casey-Cox remarked that HCC would welcome the Trust's support in the strategic long-term ventures that generate wellbeing in the community, as well as in renewable energy projects that would provide inspiration and education leadership opportunities.

Councillor Hutt enquired as to the scale of the Company's Battery Energy Storage System facility and there was a brief discussion with regard to its business model.

Trustee West thanked the HCC representatives for their presentation, and they left the meeting at 3.02pm.

There was a discussion around determining need from the content of grant applications, particularly those written by professional grant writers.

There was also a discussion with regard to electricity pricing, and the requirements the Company must meet under Commerce Commission regulations.

MOVED: (West/Johnston) That:

- 1. The submissions be received.
- 2. The Trust sends each submitter a written response to their feedback.
- 3. The 2023-24 Draft Annual Plan and Budget be adopted, subject to the amendment as approved under Item T/23/02/1.1.
