T/24/11/1.0 DISTRIBUTIONS/IMPACT

T/24/11/1.1 Grants Committee Meeting Held 17 September 2024 (Ref: 60/30)

A report from the Grants Manager dated 18 September 2024 was circulated.

The Grants Manager summarised his report which included recommendations on three Convening and Organisational Development grant applications and six Vital Impact grant applications; four from the Vital Impact Collaborative Energy (VICE) Fund (two of which carry conditional aspects) and two from the Vital Impact Community Connectedness and Cohesion 2023/24 carry-over funds.

The Grants Manager explained that, after some conversations with WEL Networks Ltd, there would be some conditions placed around future applications to the VICE Fund, including the approval of applicants' inverter/metering systems and solar plans by the Company.

Trustee West added that, with the potential for increased support of these types of applications to the Trust, discussions had been had with the Company to ensure it would not be significantly impacted.



Trustee Harvey initiated a brief discussion with regard to clarification of the collaborative aspect/purpose of the VICE Fund. It was reiterated that solar/battery projects supported would need to be advantageous to the Company, and lighting applications, particularly for priority projects as identified by Sport Waikato, would be considered via this Fund.

Trustee West provided some rationale behind the Grants Committee's recommendation to support Creative Waikato's project, Auahatanga ki te Kainga | Art in the Neighbourhood, which would involve a number of agencies and community partners in the region. The Grants Manager expressed that there is great potential to deliver the planned outcomes as every aspect of this collaborative project had been taken into account. Emerging Director, Andrew Corkill added that it demonstrated Creative Waikato could pivot and deliver on its purposes despite facing funding cuts. Trustee Chew conveyed his support, highlighting Creative Waikato's visibility in the community and its sound management.

The Grants Manager gave an update with regard to Maungatautari Ecological Island Trust's viability. He also provided some clarification relating to the recommendation for Waikato Women's Refuge – Te Whakaruruhau.

Trustee Afeaki highlighted the importance of the communication around the potential significant grant to Creative Waikato, particularly around the partnership aspect.
