March 2025 Community Support Grants Round (Ref: 60/15)

A report from the Grants Manager dated 21 May 2025 was circulated. A spreadsheet including Trustee notes was circulated separately, listing the 26 applications to be considered against their strength of alignment with the newly-adopted 2025-28 Community Investment Strategy.

T/25/04/2.1 WEL Networks Ltd – Annual General Meeting (Ref: 45/30)

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) explained that, with the Company's AGM coming up, it was necessary to formally appoint a proxy to represent the Trust at said meeting.
